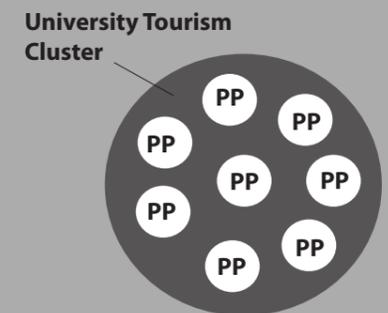

Creating integration between various researchers from schools in USM:
 - to bid consultancy project
 - to apply research grant
 in collaboration from Ministry of Tourism, Tourism Malaysia, State Tourism Action Council and international/ local agencies.

Implications

1. Cost and Finance
 - require a strategic space to organise the tourism cluster
 - require permanent supporting staff such as research officer etc.
2. Research/Grant/Consultancy Project
 - Researcher has to take the initiative to acquire opportunities and apply for projects/grants to ensure cluster operation operates actively.
3. Undivided commitment from researchers



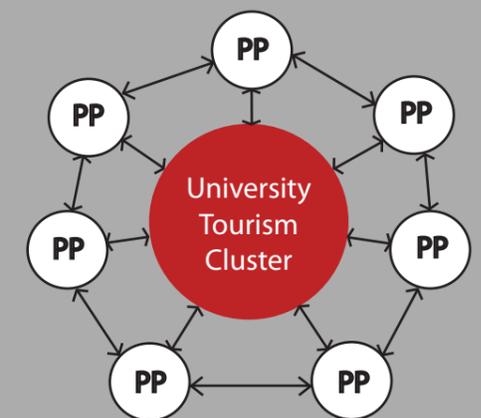
Model 1: Positioning researchers from schools in USM under one Tourism Cluster at University Level

Proposal: Model of Tourism Cluster 2

Strengthening cooperation networking in sharing sub-component tourism expertise such as:
 - Development and Planning
 - Economy and statistic
 - Management, hospitality and human resource
 - Geography
 - Marketing and Communication
 - Law, etc.

Implications

1. Cost and Finance
 - require a minimum cost, does not require a specific space and permanent supporting staff such as research officer etc. to organise the tourism cluster
2. Research/Grant/Consultancy Project
 - Researchers cooperate with each other and share their expertise to support acquired projects
3. Researchers have the initiative to give undivided commitment
